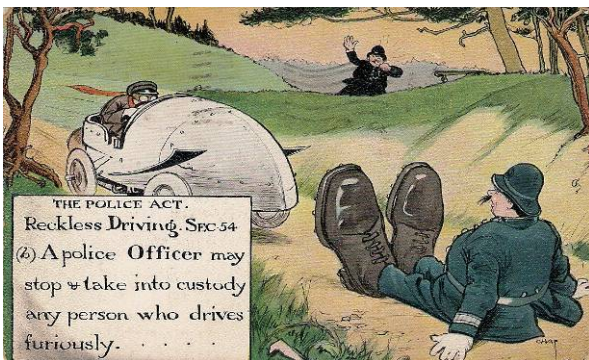
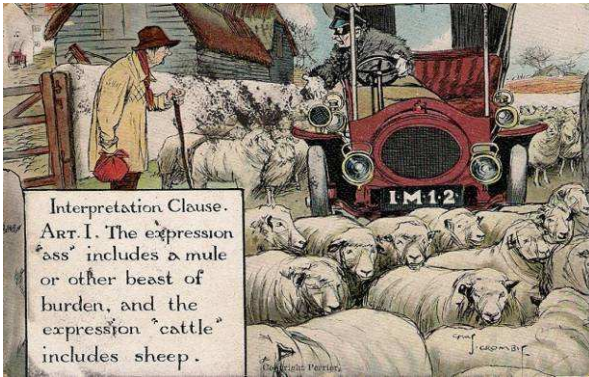
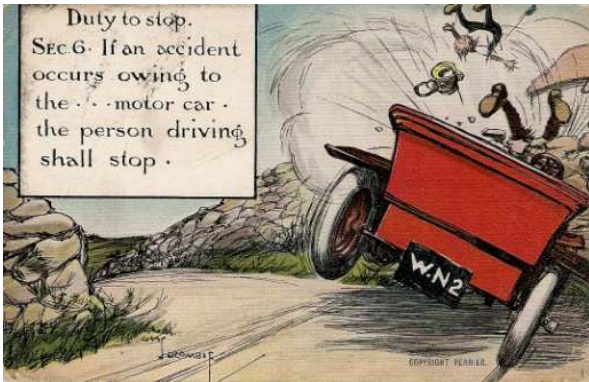


CHARLES EXETER DEVEREUX CROMBIE

1880 – 1967

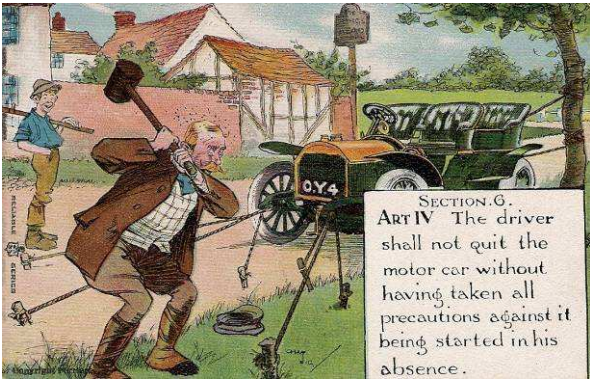

Known for an excellent series of twelve humorous prints for Perrier Water entitled 'Motoritis or Other Interpretations of the Motor Act' published in 1906. 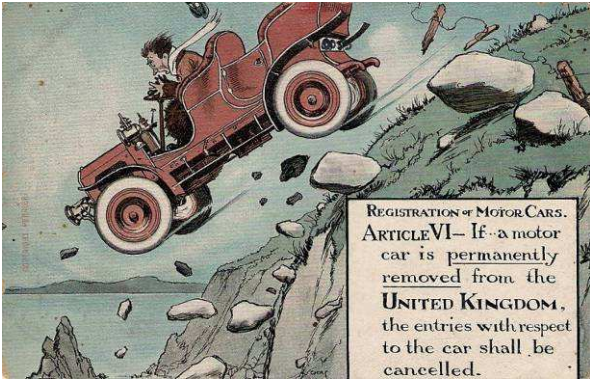

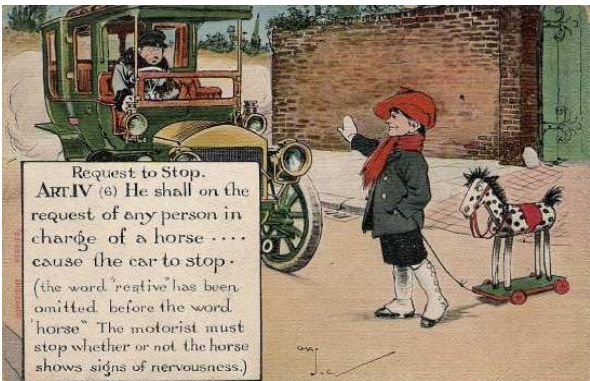
SECTION G.
ART IV The driver shall not quit the motor car without having taken all precautions against it being started in his absence.



REGISTRATION OF MOTOR CARS.
ARTICLE VI- If a motor car is permanently removed from the UNITED KINGDOM, the entries with respect to the car shall be cancelled.



Control over Car.
ART IV (2). He shall not when on the car be in such a position that he cannot have control over same.

ART IV (6) He shall on the request of any person in charge of a horse . . . cause the car to stop.
